RAND: Playworks impacts 5 school climate indicators

A RAND Corporation review (2017) found that the Playworks Coach service has a statistically significant impact on five school climate indicators and is one of only a few social and emotional learning programs to show "strong evidence" of impact under ESSA guidelines. Several other Playworks services also meet one of the four ESSA levels of evidence; all are based on the Playworks theory of change.

Stanford: Playworks reduces chronic absenteeism and increases attendance

An independent evaluation by Stanford University (2015) found that the Playworks Coach service led to a statistically significant increase in attendance among elementary school children. That increase was greatest among chronically absent students.
