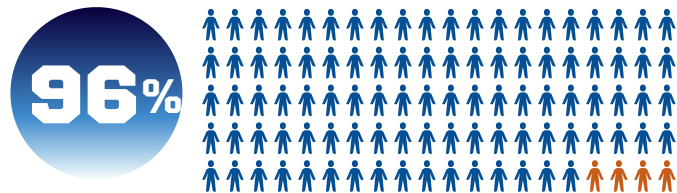

Year two of the All IN Sports program continues to show that its formula of caring adults in low-stakes, developmental sporting environments creates spaces for students where they feel supported, engaged, and a part of something bigger. Continued partnerships with organizations, such as Indiana Sports Corps, Gatorade, the Colts, and others, has continued to yield consistently high-quality events and experiences for young people.

JUNIOR COACH LEADERS

Between Fall 2021 and Spring 2022, Playworks collaborated with Partnerships in Education and Resilience (PEAR) to collect data across 8 regions including Indiana. Data was collected from 710 4th and 5th graders in schools offering both Playworks' Coach program and Playworks' TeamUp program.

Junior Coaches completed the Holistic Student Assessment (HSAR) Retrospective Self-Change (RSC) survey which measures 14 social and emotional outcomes. Junior Coaches read specific statements and rated how they felt now compared to before becoming a Junior Coach.

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Playworks Programs Enhance Holistic Childhood Development

Students participating in Playworks Junior Coach programs reported statistically significant* positive change on all 14 scales of the Holistic Student Assessment-Retrospective Self-Change survey.
