### What is a Recess Coach?

A school staff member who is dedicated to delivering and strengthening a great recess, every day. The Recess Coach is a vital part of continuing a consistently high-functioning recess, and is ideally present at most (if not all) of the recess periods at your school. This person leads the implementation of recess every day – setting up and tearing down games, supervising the junior coaches, modeling our strategies for the students and other recess staff (rock paper scissors, high fives, "good job nice try"), and engaging with students in playing the games. This person models the expectations of recess, leads the way for impact through play at school, and supports all staff and students during recess.

### I'm the Recess Coach. Now what?!

Now the fun begins! During our time together, we ask that you specifically take great notes on the planning that we do. After all, your teammates will come to see you as a leader and resource for moving recess forward. We also recommend working with your Recess Manager to condense all of the planning into a manual, or creating some type of tangible, visible guide for current and future Recess Team members to refer to.

# Awesome. I'll take stellar notes, I'm planning to make a tangible resource for our team, and I've got a solid grasp on the games. How do I take all this planning and put it into action?

Great question. The implementation will occur in stages. And, the whole Recess Team will be part of making sure recess is successful and sustainable. Create a checklist of things you can plan to develop and grow on a month-to-month basis. And remember, every school is different! Some schools roll out the entire plan in a month, while other schools take six months or even a full school year.

## What's a Consultation Visit (CV)? Do we need to prepare for it?

Some schools will be participating in Consultation Visits (CV). During the CV, Playworks staff will meet with you and your recess team to track your progress, reflect on recess challenges/successes, and set some next steps to take your recess to the next level!
