A Citywide Effort Aimed at Getting Young People More Active

Recognizing that physical activity is more important than ever, a group of local nonprofit partners launched Boston Back in Motion - an effort to get young people to stay active as schools transition back to in-person learning. The initiative aimed to provide motivation and resources to educators, after-school providers, families, and kids to help spark physical activity every day for young people.

Six Boston schools were awarded a total of \$25,000 in wellness grants for participating in the campaign during the month of April. In total, more than 55 groups – representing more than 3,100 students – signed up to participate in the daily movement breaks.

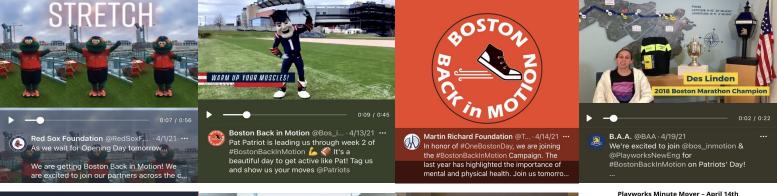


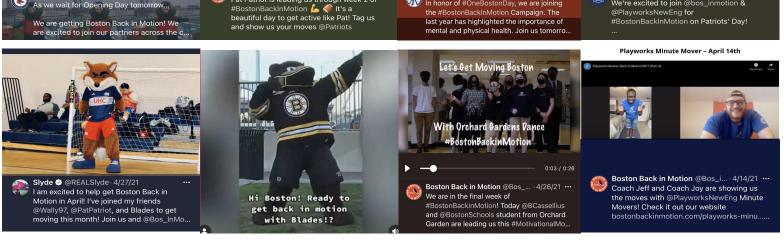
