Safe and healthy play is proven to strengthen student relationships with adults and peers, help students manage emotions and reduce stress, increase feelings of safety, improve academic achievement, return classroom time, and build a more positive school environment.

Playworks helps launch Boston Back in Motion to get kids moving

Recognizing that physical activity is more important than ever, a group of nonprofit partners launched Boston Back in Motion an effort to get young people to stay active as schools transitioned back to in-person learning. The initiative provided motivation and resources to educators, after-school providers, families, and kids to help spark physical activity every day for young people.

The effort was led by The Boston Foundation through a partnership with Playworks, BOKS Kids, and BPS Moves Together as well as the Red Sox Foundation, the Boston Bruins Foundation, the New England Revolution Charitable Foundation, the New England Patriots Foundation, and The Boston Athletic Association.
