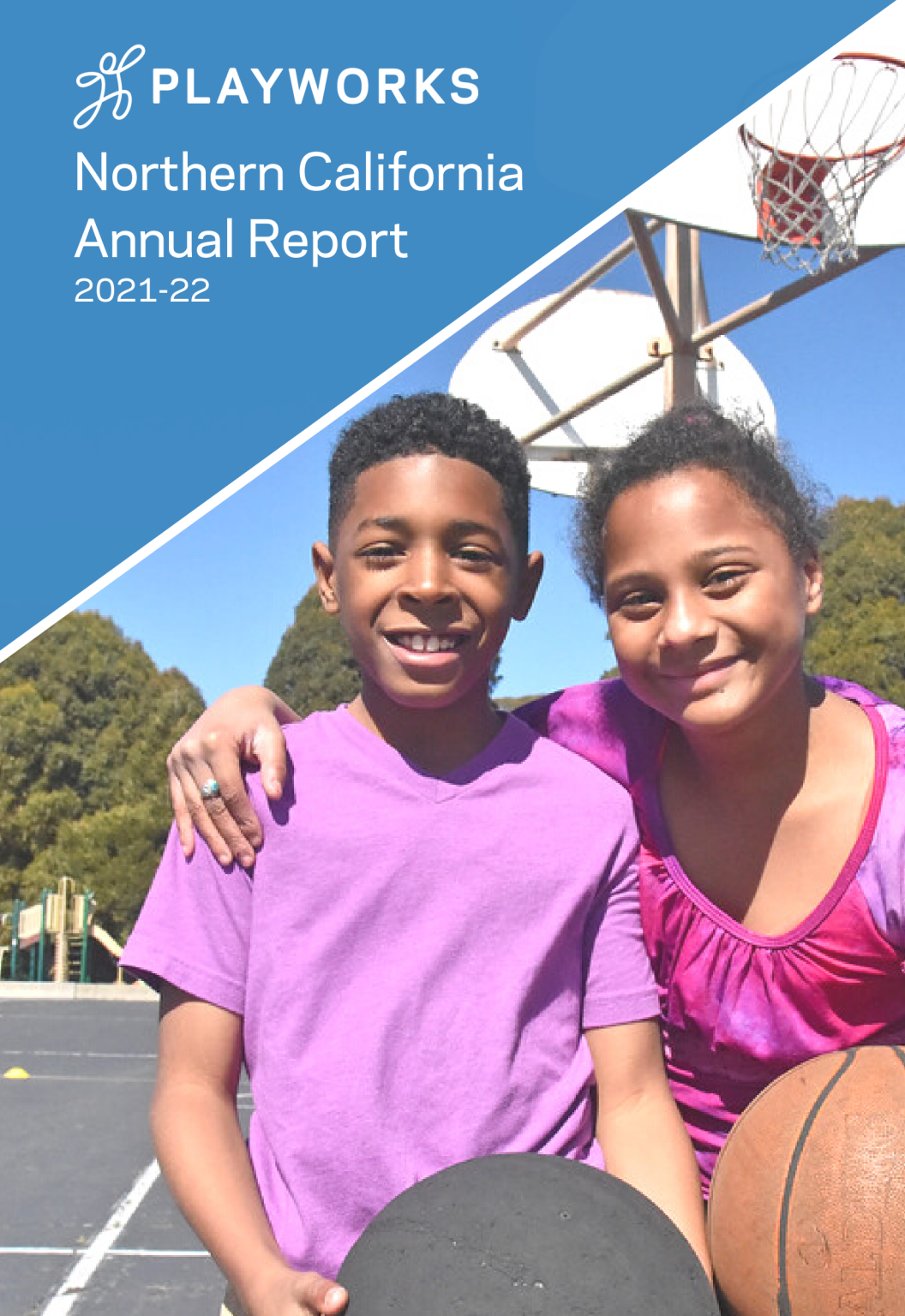

OUR IMPACT

Every year, Playworks surveys our partner schools to learn about the impact of our programs and find ways to improve. Here are a few highlights from educators surveyed this year:

92%

report that Playworks helps students develop the skills they need to succeed in their learning community

97%

report that Playworks helps the school create opportunities for inclusion of diverse groups of students

85%

of educators report that during learning time Playworks increase students' ability to focus on class activities

96%

agree that Playworks increases the number of students that are physically active.





Returning to the Playground

As school campuses reopened in 2021-22, Playworks staff focused on teaching – and re-teaching – basic life skills to students who hadn't had the opportunity to play together for a year due to the pandemic.

Recess proved to be a particularly challenging time. Many kids struggled with cooperation, were overly physical with each other and generally needed support making connections with their peers. It was clear that healing from collective trauma and focusing on mental and physical health would need to be a huge part of returning to school. Playworks, with its emphasis on safe and healthy play, was uniquely positioned to support this transition.

Playworks staff worked to re-introduce foundational skills by focusing on games that promoted community building, connection and conflict resolution. To empower all children to participate fully, we prioritized teaching kids how to play in groups, rather than teaching many different games and even spent time going over the physical boundaries of the playground. With the support of the caring adults at our partner schools, we were able to once again transform school cultures, this time in a post-pandemic world.

By the end of the year, we were thrilled to see our school playgrounds once again filled with games, teamwork, leadership and most importantly, joy.

Growth for the Long Term

Playworks Northern California is thrilled to build on the momentum of the 21-22 program year. This Fall, a subset of our leadership staff including voices from direct services, pro services and development are participating in a strategic planning process to determine how we will increase our impact over the next two years.

In the 22-23 school year we are excited to be piloting Relay, a new service offering where coaches rotate between 2-3 schools instead of being rooted on a single campus. This new model allows us to work with a greater number of students and helps us build sustainable service delivery in partnership with school staff.
