







Pre-Pandemic Reach




Post-Pandemic Reach

Junior Coach Statistical Significance

Junior Coaches in the Pacific Northwest reported statistically significant positive change on all **14** scales of the Holistic Student Assessment Retrospective Self-Change survey by the Pear Institute. The scales were: academic motivation, action orientation, assertiveness, critical thinking, emotion control, empathy, learning interest, optimism, perseverance, reflection, relationships with adults, relationships with peers, school bonding, and trust.



DIRECT SERVICE HIGHLIGHT

RE-ESTABLISHING PRESENCE IN THE SEATTLE-PUGET SOUND AREA

Pre-pandemic, Playworks PacNW served **4** schools in the Seattle-Puget Sound area through TeamUp with a Site Coordinator, and delivered a multitude of trainings with PRO trainers across the region.

Casey Gackle was hired in November 2022 to serve **3** schools through TeamUp and train as a Program Specialist to deliver PRO services across the region.

CELEBRATING A CHAMPION OF PLAY



I first learned about Playworks at an ASCD conference in San Francisco and was impressed with their values and the idea of valuing play for

everyone as a way to build culture, increase instructional minutes and engage students with inclusive activities. Fast forward to my first year as an administrator of a very broken school. I had a student leave campus and end up on a four lane highway headed to the airport because she was tired of being bullied. The problem? Foursquare. I scoured the internet for my local Playworks organization and got connected with a lunch-and-learn opportunity. Over the next nine years, we used Team Up or Recess Reboot five different times to onboard new staff and students to the mindset that EVERYONE is included in play. My school saw a dramatic decrease in

referrals on the playground and an increase in recaptured instructional minutes because we weren't problem solving recess issues before returning to learn. In addition, more kids were engaged in healthy, active play! Fast forward again, this time in a new school in a different community in a post-pandemic world. What we were struggling with was kids with no imagination for play. Our stakeholder data showed that kids don't feel included or feel that students at this school were kind. Parents' surveys echoed the same sentiment about kindness and safety. Chase games (predator/prey) were the best kids could come up with on their own. Time to call Playworks again. By training staff to engage in play with students, by giving structured play as an option, by providing the tools, the rules and the organized space to play, students report feeling safer on the playground. When organized play is used we see a reduction in referrals and an increase in reclaimed instructional minutes. Having a coach train staff and students to play in a way that is inclusive, creative, and explicit as a way to boost your school culture is invaluable. And the Junior Coach program is an incredible tool to build leadership skills, in addition to helping students take ownership of their playground!

JUNIOR COACH LEADERSHIP CONFERENCE RETURNS IN THE PACNW

The PacNW 2023 Junior Coach Conference came back stronger than ever after 3 years in which we were unable to host the event. The goal of the Junior Coach Conference is to celebrate and highlight the accomplishments of Junior Coaches at each of our TeamUp









We hosted the event at Parkrose High School, a district where we support all 4 elementary schools with TeamUp programming. We were able to lean into a strong relationship built with the superintendent of the district in order to secure the space. The theme for the 2023 Junior Coach Conference was Joy, Create, Celebrate. We designed a zone for recess games and activities in which students could play games and experience joy. They were able to create tangible and intangible memories with craft and chalk stations. We ended with a ceremony where each Junior Coach received a certificate in front of their peers and families.

Not only did we have **150** Junior Coaches from **26** different schools in attendance, which is a record number for TeamUp partnerships, but their school communities and families were also invited and present. Some of the highlights of the day were the ability to provide lunch and an ice cream truck visit for everyone at the conference, students who stepped up to speak about their experiences, and an amazing testimonial from the principal of Sacramento Elementary in the Parkrose district.



IMPACT STORY

On May 20th, 2023, we had half of our Junior Coaches and many of their families attend Playworks' annual Junior Coach Conference at Parkrose High School. We had a day full of recess games, art stations, pizza and ice cream, and capped it all off with a graduation ceremony.



An extra shout-out to Lena for taking on the challenge of being one of our student speakers during the ceremony, where she spoke in front of 137 Junior Coaches and their families, from 18 schools around the Portland metro area. Her speech about her experience as a Junior Coach and her efforts to support inclusion at soccer during recess over the course of this year blew us all away!"

PARTNERSHIP WITH SOUTHERN OREGON **EDUCATION SCHOOL DISTRICT**

While our partnership began with the Southern Oregon Education District (SOESD) in 2022 by launching digital services across the ESD. Their longer term hopes were to Southern Oregon Education Service District align their efforts across districts by providing baseline services and monitoring impact

over the course of several years. In, 2023, we deepened our partnership by building on custom services in the districts where uptake and proof of concept had taken, and continued to create baselines for other districts to get on board at a pace that made sense for them. This custom approach, built on continued access to digital services, consultation hours, and on-site training both varied depending on the needs of each district, and allowed us to continue to collaborate throughout the year with an eye on maximum impact. These efforts were driven in large part by the collaboration between Tami Daoud of Playworks and Tanya Frisendahl of SOESD over the course of several years where they engaged in mapping and planning a strategic approach to sustainable impact in these school communities. The SOESD is one of the largest ESD geographically in Oregon, it serves 3,500 teachers, 13 public school districts and 52,000 students in Jackson, Josephine and Klamath Counties—a 10,600 square-mile geographic area.

PROGRAM INNOVATION

TagTeam





Playworks TagTeam is a multi-year certification program for out-of-school-time (OST) organizations. We are training the OST staff to launch a recess service (modeled after Coach) at local elementary schools in their community. Year one of TagTeam includes deep, ongoing (primarily virtual) support from Playworks while the OST organization kicks off in-school recess (3+ days/week) and Junior Coach programming at 1-3 schools. OST staff at the frontline and manager levels are accountable for attending Playworks events and completing assigned coursework throughout the year. At the end of year one, when all requirements are complete, the OST organization becomes a "certified Playworks TagTeam provider" and gains access to special branding privileges, valid for one year. During years two and beyond, Playworks provides lighter-touch support at a lower cost. The OST partner sustains programming or expands services to more schools. At the end of every subsequent year—contingent on successful completion of all requirements—OST partners get recertified for another year.



Target Audience: School Staff & Out-of-School-Time Staff




What it is: A full-year subscription resource of online courses to encourage school staff use effective, research-backed practices to help play support learning & maintain great recess and play environments throughout the school year.


