



DIGITAL SERVICES EXPANSION

In an effort to expand our impact, we launched a new digital service called PlayworksU. PlayworksU is an online education platform of more than 32 courses that empower school staff to leverage safe and healthy play on their own. PlayworksU is available at a lower cost than our direct services, thus allowing schools without the budget for a higher-cost program to implement the strategies to develop a more overall positive school culture.



SOCIAL ENTREPRENEUR OF THE YEAR

Our Executive Director, Chris Conard, was named Ernst and Young's 2019 Social Entrepreneur of the Year for his passion for play, and commitment to helping Utah kids thrive both inside the classroom and out. Chris has led the growth of Playworks in Utah from five schools in 2011, to 115 schools today, impacting over 66,000 kids all while innovating around new services and piloting new programs to better serve Playworks' partners along the way.



JUNIOR COACH LEADERSHIP




