Diego Sanchez: An Emerging Leader

From the moment he saw his older brother lead as a Junior Coach at Rogers Street Academy, Diego Sanchez was inspired to step into leadership. Diego's drive to make a difference was clear. In fact, he eagerly asked to become a Junior Coach when he was only in first grade. Recognizing the spark of emerging leadership, the school's Recess Manager (the school's recess coordinator), encouraged Diego to keep being a good role model, and assured him that his time to lead will come.

The school's Recess Manager, Josh Heinrich, fondly known as Mr. H. recognized that Diego's time had arrived. Now in third grade, Diego was one of just five students handpicked to begin

Junior Coaching a year early. Paired with Legacy Coaches, older students in sixth and seventh grade, Diego began training one on one, shadowing and learning from the Legacy Coaches leadership. Though he was shy and reserved at first, Diego quickly stood out for his determination and heart.

He was paired with Aiden, a seasoned Legacy Coach, and the two formed a powerful duo. Early on, Diego mirrored Aiden's coaching style and strategies. As the year went on, they shared responsibilities, with Diego taking the lead more and more. By the end of the school year, Diego grew as leader while helping Aiden grow as a mentor.

When the school's gym underwent renovations and a brand new soccer field opened, Junior Coaches faced a whirlwind of changes. Diego often found himself leading games solo, even coaching students older than himself. He stepped up with confidence, introducing new games, resolving playground conflicts, and holding kids accountable with kindness and fairness.

Diego's bilingual skills became another superpower. Many days, he led entire games in Spanish for up to 25 kindergarteners. They adored him.

Diego says the encouragement from his Coach, Mr. H, and fellow Junior Coaches gave him the courage to step out of his comfort zone. Now, he's not just participating, he's leading.



Diego's story is a powerful reminder that leaders will emerge when they are developed and cultivated with the proper support and opportunity. The Junior Coach Leadership Program at Rogers Street Academy was successful because of the strong partnership between Playworks and the school's Recess Rockstar, Mr. H. This demonstrates how the Junior Coach Leadership Program empowers each student to grow into a strong, confident leader.
