Who We Are

We believe in the power of play to bring out the best in every child. We create a place for every child on the playground. A place where every child belongs, has fun and is part of the game. Playworks' vision is that one day, every child in America will have access to safe, healthy play, recognizing that play creates valuable opportunities for children to grow physically, emotionally and socially. Research shows play is essential to a child's development and an invaluable tool for improving school climate. Playworks began operating in two public schools in Berkeley, California in 1996. Since that time, it has grown to 23 regions nationwide including Michigan.

ABOUT PLAYWORKS

What We Do

Our experience over the years has demonstrated that relatively simple intervention - placing one full-time, well-trained, young adult "coach" in an urban school positively impacts children's cognitive, social and physical development. Playworks coaches implement our fivecomponent youth development play and physical activity curriculum to build young people's life skills. This system also provides them with meaningful role models and leadership opportunities and foster supportive relationships with peers and adults. Those five components include an organized recess, Class Game Time, a Junior Coach Leadership Development program, an after school program and interscholastic, developmental sports leagues.

Why We Do It Teachers tell us the children do

Teachers tell us the children do better in school when they have a good experience on the playground. Principals say that children no longer spend important learning time sitting in their office after a lunchtime dispute, that children get along better and bullying decreases. Teachers can then do what they do best - TEACH!

HYPE ATHLETICS

The mission of H.Y.P.E. Athletics Community is to create and strengthen infrastructures that support the positive development of Wayne County youth through athletic participation and competition, educational tutoring and literacy development, and Social awareness with mentoring, counseling, life skills training and substance abuse education and prevention.

H.Y.P.E. Athletics Community was established in April 2001 to provide Wayne County area children a positive and constructive outlet through organized sports - free from drugs and violence.

HYPE Athletics Community has two components. The first component includes athletic training camps, leagues and tournaments in basketball, football, baseball, soccer, volleyball, tennis and more. Our second component being a social driven service offered to the youth and their families with tutoring, mentoring, counseling, substance abuse prevention and education and young professional entrepreneurial and leadership training. In addition, H.Y.P.E. offers Training Camps, Leagues & Tournaments in Basketball, Soccer, Football, Baseball, Volleyball, Tennis and Wrestling.

HYPE prides itself on being a diverse and harmonious youth organization, servicing Wayne County, Michigan Youth. HYPE Athletics Community prides itself in providing culturally competent services to the populations of youth involved in its programs. The organization exhibits an ongoing acceptance of and respect for differences in the populations served, pays careful attention to the dynamics of those differences, and makes adaptations to the service model(s) in order to best meet the needs of different racial and / or ethnic groups. HYPE Athletics Community retains staff that represent the racial and ethnic makeup of youth and communities being served, and the administration and Board of Directors provides support to staff to become comfortable working in cross-cultural situations.

COMMUNITY SERVICE

YOUNG DETROIT BUILDERS

Young Detroit Builders (YDB) strives to develop the positive energy and the capacity of young adult Detroiters to be personally and professionally successful; models for others, and a force in rebuilding low-income communities.

YouthBuild Detroit, the primary program of YDB, a full time, 10 month program that provides on-the-job construction training with national certifications. GED preparatory education, career, leadership and life skills development, and counseling for young adults are just some of the benefits of participation. Included is a small stipend that is paid to all participants who maintain at least 85% attendance.

While in the program trainees learn as they build and rehabilitate affordable housing for low-income families and the homeless. Once trainees complete the program they receive assistance with Post-Secondary Education and job placement. Select trainees may also receive the opportunity to earn funding for post-secondary education as part time AmeriCorps members.

YouthBuild Detroit trainees have worked on the Woodbridge Estates, the Villages of Parkside Public Housing developments, completed rehabilitation of single-family homes in partnership with the U-SNAP-BAC Nonprofit Housing Corporation and on homes owned by YDB in the North Star neighborhood. Trainees worked with Habitat for Humanity Detroit building new homes in the Core City Neighborhoods community and have worked with Clear Corps Detroit on Health and Safety repairs for families with children. YDB has a long-standing relationship with Rebuilding Together Detroit and Christmas in April Detroit to complete repairs and improvements for low-income seniors and veterans. Among these large projects, trainees have also constructed over 80 wheel chair ramps in the Detroit area. YDB is currently partnered with Write A House to renovate homes that will bring literary writers into a Detroit neighborhood as residents.


INCLUSION

LORETTA V. DAVIS, INSTITUTE FOR POPULATION HEALTH

Commitment - it separates doers from dreamers: and Loretta V. Davis, public health executive and avid reader of John C. Maxwell, not only gets the job done every time, but does so in a way that puts community health first. Ms. Davis's management experience spans 25 years, two sectors, a myriad of key public health issues and a full range of administrative and operational functions, including fiscal management, contract negotiations, policy and procedure development. personnel management, and program design and development. Now President and CEO of the Institute for Population Health, Ms. Davis joins the ranks of only four other city-level public health institute CEOs across the United States. In this position she oversees the provision of public health services to the residents and visitors of the City of Detroit. A well-respected public health leader, Ms. Davis has been called upon to respond to a number of public health challenges throughout her career. In addition to leading the formation of the Institute for Population Health, she has led the financial repair of five clinics across southeast Michigan, bringing them from deficit spending to viability; mobilized a county's response to the H1N1 flu pandemic; served as a principal partner in creating and implementing Michigan's early response to HIV/AIDS; and partnered in crafting the HIV/AIDS response in Ethiopia. Despite the demands of her career, Ms. Davis generously extends her leadership expertise to serve in her community. She served as Vice Chairperson of the Western Wayne Family Health Center Board of Directors, in addition to her membership on numerous other

boards of directors. Ms. Davis earned her Bachelor of Arts degree in Sociology from the University of Michigan, and her Master of Science in Health Service Administration from Central Michigan University.

CEO and Founder Jill Vialet has spent more than 25 years in the nonprofit sector, focusing her entrepreneurial skills on creating and developing two successful nonprofit organizations for kids.

In 1996, Vialet launched Sports4Kids, now called Playworks, in two Berkeley, CA elementary schools. Playworks believes in the power of play to bring out the best in every kid and creates a place for every kid on the playground – a place where they belong, have fun and are part of the game. Playworks creates safe, inclusive school environments that allow kids to thrive and discover their own superpowers. We currently serve more than 380 schools in 23 cities, and expect to reach nearly 425,000 students directly and through training services that reach hundreds of additional schools and community organizations.

Prior to Playworks, Vialet co-founded the Museum of Children's Art (MOCHA), an organization dedicated to helping families and communities celebrate the art and creativity of their children. As executive director, Jill developed an "artists in residency" program in the schools and brought artists to work with children in pediatric wards of hospitals. She served as the executive director at mocha for nine years, ultimately expanding its programs to reach 20,000 young people each year.

Vialet graduated from Harvard University where she studied medical sociology, played rugby, and became actively involved with Harvard's service-learning community. Vialet served as the director of Harvard's Public Service Program during the 1986-87 school year. In 1996, she was awarded Radcliffe's Jane Rainie Opel Award for achievement by a young alumna.

Vialet was a Eureka Fellow from 2000 to 2001, and 2004 she was selected as an Ashoka Fellow. Vialet and Playworks were selected as a member of the Clinton Global Initiative in 2009. Jill was recently named to the Forbes Impact 30 as one of the 30 leading social entrepreneurs worldwide. She was also recognized by the Womens' Sports Foundation's 40 for 40 list of women who have made a significant impact on society after playing sports in high school or college during the 40 years of the Title IX era.

Vialet was among a small group of Californians honored with a 2013 James Irvine Foundation Leadership Award for her contributions to advancing proven, innovative solutions to some of California's most difficult problems. Jill plays actively by running and mountain biking, among other outdoor activities.


